iKickButts User Guide



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1. Downloading the App

To download the app on your smartphone, open your device's app store and search for "iKickButts." Look for the app with the following icon and tap "Download" or "Install" to add the app to your device. When the installation is complete, tap "Open" to launch the app



2. Creating Your Account

To access the app's features, you'll need to sign in or create an account. On the main login screen, tap "Create Account" and follow the on-screen instructions to register. Once your account is set up, return to the login screen and sign in using your credentials.

3. Submitting Observations – Explore Page



Tap the eye-andmagnifying-glass icon to either capture a photo of TEC waste using your phone's camera or upload a photo from your phone's library.



After capturing or uploading a photo, identify and categorize the TEC waste by tapping the product(s) in the image. Then, select the TEC waste type from the drop-down menu on the left and enter the quantity on the right.



If an image contains multiple types of TEC waste or waste items scattered in different locations, you can identify, categorize, tag, and count each type separately.





Prior to submission, edit and review observation details, including date, time, pick-up status, project association, and notes.



If you would like return to the tagging screen, tap on the icon to the left of the image. This will return you to the previous screen where you can modify the TEC waste type, count, or location.





Tap the slider next to "Was the waste picked up?" to indicate if you picked up the waste item.



Select the project you would like to assign the observation to. Please note, if you are already assigned to one project, the observation will automatically be assigned that project.



If you have joined multiple projects, you will be asked which project to submit the observation to. Tapping the drop-down menu, you can select which project that you would like the observation to be assigned to.



Or, you can remove the observation from any projects by selecting, "None"



Once you are done, tap the "Submit" button to submit your observation. Or tap "Cancel" to cancel the observation submission.



Once submitted, you may view your own and other users' observations submitted on both the interactive map and in a list located beneath the map.

4. Viewing TEC Waste Observations – Explore Page



Above the map, you can refine observations displayed on map and reports by applying filters based on criteria such as time period, type, and projects.

Map Filter Example: Selecting "Cannabis" for the waste type filter, and "Past 6 Months" for the time filter will display observations of cannabis waste taken over the past 6 months on the map and observation lists



Tapping on any observation in the observation list will highlight it on both the map and the observation list. Similarly, tapping on any observation in the map will highlight it both on the map and the observation list.



Above the map, you have the option to select the "Map Filter On" or "Map Filter Off." If the map filter is "On," this allows you to narrow down the observations shown in the lists below, based on the location you have moved to on the map.

If you experience any while issues loading observations or applying filters to the observations list and/or map, tapping the refresh button (\bigcirc) will refresh the observations displayed on the map and observation list. You can also restart the app.

5. Generating and Sharing Reports – Explore Page



You can generate reports that summarize TEC waste observations that can be easily shared to intended audiences (e.g., friends, elected officials) as a PDF. You may also download the data files of observations in CSV format. These can be saved to your location of choice.



These reports provide automatically generated summaries and tables detailing key information, including location, dates, waste types, and quantities for each observation. They also indicate whether the waste was collected, to provide a comprehensive overview of the data.

Use the filters to customize the data included in your downloaded reports. You can refine your selection by date range, waste type, project, and location. This allows you to generate reports tailored to your specific needs.



You can easily share reports as PDF files with targeted audiences through email, social media, and text messages. The Municipal Resources feature, found in the Forum page, provides contact details such as email addresses and social media handles—of local officials in each San Diego city. These tools help ensure that important data reaches decision-makers, raising awareness and driving meaningful action on a larger scale.

7. Options for Single Observations – Explore Page



Tap the three dots next to any observation to access the available actions for that observation.



If the observation is one that you submitted, you can edit, share, or favorite the observation. You can also add the observation to a specific project.

To edit an observation, tap the three dots next to it and select "Edit Observation" to update the details of the observation.



Observations can be added to any projects you have joined.



Tap "View Observation" to view details about other users' observations, such as date and time, tagged items, and location.



You can share individual observations via email, text messages, or through various social media platforms

Mark observations as favorites for quick and easy viewing through your Profile tab.

8. Profile Page



Tapping on the "Profile" tab will allow you to see details about your account, such as your username, user level, observation count, and badges.



The bottom of the Profile tab provides important information about the app, including the version and build numbers.



Monitor how close you are to the next level or badge by reviewing your progress. Each badge represents a specific accomplishment, such as completing challenges, reaching certain milestones, or engaging with the community.
